

When the plants mature, only the top 1-2 inches of the plant are picked. These buds and leaves are called flushes. A new flush appears on the plant every seven to ten days during the peak growing season. Left to grow on its own, the tea plant may actually grow into a small tree. But in all tea gardens, the plants are pruned and kept at a height of about three feet(waist high) to enable easy plucking of the leaves. The teas we buy are usually classified according to their leaf size. Accordingly we have (1) Assam type of tea, characterized by the largest leaves; 2) China type, characterized by the smallest leaves; and (3) Cambod, characterized by leaves of intermediate size. We have three very distinct and different tea growing regions in India. Each of these regions is famous for the special type of tea it produces, which are unique in taste, aroma, strength and flavour. The three regions are: Darjeeling in North Eastern India, Assam in far North-East India and Nilgiris in South India.

To stop the ruthless cutting of trees in the Himalayas, a unique movement — Chipko was started. The word Chipko means to 'hug' or to 'embrace' in Hindi. The movement derived its name from the dramatic circumstances in which it was born. In March 1973, when tree fellers arrived in Mandal village of Uttar Pradesh to cut trees, they found that hundreds of women had gathered there. They protected the tree-felling and clung to the trees literally embracing them to save them from the axes. The don-violent protest worked and the trees were saved. From that day Chipko has become an important word in the dictionary of environmentalists activist of Tehri actively supported it. He and his volunteers travelled on foot from village to village to educate and involved the local people on the urgent need of forest conservation. 'Our blue-print is not only for the saving of the trees but for the survival of mankind,' said Bahuguna. Similar to the Chipko movement is the Appico (meaning 'to hug' in Kannada) movement started in Karnataka. The movements motivated many other activities to fight against tree-felling.
